Discussion Questions (After Reading)

- 1. Is it better to be a kid now, or was it better to be a kid twenty-five or fifty years ago? Explain.
- 2. In *The Island of Dr. Libris*, Billy spends a lot of time alone until he meets Walter. Do you like spending time by yourself, or do you get lonely or bored when you are alone? Explain.
- 3. Robin Hood is known for stealing from the rich to give to the poor. Is it ever okay to do a bad thing in order to do a good thing? For example, it is okay to tell a lie or cheat if it will help someone? Explain.
- 4. Do you think time travel is possible? Why or why not?
- 5. If you could travel to any time, past or present, to what place and time would you go? Why?
- 6. What book would you bring to life if you could? Why?
- 7. In *The Island of Dr. Libris,* a shark-o-dile is a combination of a shark and a crocodile. What animal would you create by combining two animals? What would your animal be called?
- 8. Can anyone be a hero? Why or why not? Do you think that you could be a hero? Explain.
- 9. At the end of *The Island of Dr. Libris,* Billy decides that he didn't need to find buried treasure. He just needed to remember what he already had. What are the things that you are grateful for?
- 10. Pollyanna always looks on the bright side. Do you? Why or why not?
- 11. Do you think we get to make our own happy endings in life? Explain.

Activities

- 1. In the story, Dr. Libris is an interesting villain. If you could create your own villain, what would his (or her) name be? What would he or she look like? Why is he or she evil? What would make your villain unique? Draw a picture of your villain and write a character sketch describing him or her.
- 2. Pretend that Hercules, Robin Hood, Maid Marian, the three Musketeers, Tom Sawyer, and Pollyanna are coming to visit your town for the weekend. What would you do for fun? What food would you serve them? Where would they sleep? How would you introduce them to your friends? Write an itinerary for their visit and/or write a skit explaining what happens when they come to your town.
- 3. Dr. Libris considers the dome a "maze" for Billy to solve. Using a ruler and/or graph paper, create your own maze and give it to a friend to solve.
- 4. In *The Island of Dr. Libris*, the Sheriff of Nottingham posts several "Wanted" signs. Create your own "Wanted" sign! Ask someone to take your picture against a plain backdrop and print it out, or use your school picture or another picture that you have. (If you would like a challenge, draw a picture of yourself.) On a poster, paste your picture and write an explanation for why you are "Wanted." For example, the following could be on a "Wanted" sign for author Chris Grabenstein, the author of *The Island of Dr. Libris:* "Wanted: Chris Grabenstein. He has kidnapped characters from famous stories to entertain children. Beware! Chris is armed with an out-of-control imagination, a Mac computer, and a dramatic dog named Fred. His sidekicks include characters like Riley Mack, Zack Jennings, and Kyle Keeley. He also pals around with James Patterson. Chris has already escaped from Mr. Lemoncello's Library, so consider him dangerous. Chris is known to dress in yellow and travels around the country visiting schools. If you find him, please return him to J.J. in New York City. She promises to keep an eye on him."
- 5. At the end of *The Island of Dr. Libris,* Billy realizes that he has a lot to be thankful for. Write a letter to someone who has made a difference in your life.
- 6. Find the list of books mentioned in the author's note. Bring the list to your librarian and ask him or her to recommend one of those books to you. Check out the book and read it!

Writing and Research Assignments (Aligned to the Common Core)

- 1. In Chapter 2, Billy finds a plaque with the following quote from Carl Sagan: "A book is proof that humans are capable of working magic." What does this quote mean? How does this quote apply to *The Island of Dr. Libris*? Write a short essay explaining the quote and relating the quote to *The Island of Dr. Libris*.
- 2. In the beginning of the story, Billy destroys his iPhone. Think of an object that is important to you. Imagine how you would feel if you lost or broke this object. Write a story with a beginning, middle, and end explaining what happened to your object. How did you replace the object? What obstacles did you face? Who helped you? Be sure to include details to explain what happened and how you solved your problem.
- 3. In *The Island of Dr. Libris*, Billy reads a lot of books. What is the best book that you have ever read? Write a book review recommending this book to others. You should provide a brief introduction to the plot, but do not give the ending away. Include the title, author, and genre of the book in your review. Be sure to make the book sound appealing by using persuasive language and appropriate details.
- 4. One of the problems that Billy faces is dealing with Nick Farkas, who is a bully. Write an anonymous letter to Nick to convince him to stop being a bully.
- 5. Research M.C. Escher, Mythology, Mark Twain, the legend of Robin Hood, black holes, or any other topic that you discovered in *The Island of Dr. Libris*. Write a short report explaining what you learned. Be sure to make a list of the books, websites, or databases that you used. Remember to put the information into your own words.
- 6. Bullying is a common problem in schools. Do some research on the different types of bullying. Find out how to handle a bully. Share what you have learned with your class by creating a presentation, poster, or pamphlet.
- 7. Both Dr. Libris and the Sheriff of Nottingham are villains. Write an essay comparing and contrasting them.
- 8. Who is you favorite character in *The Island of Dr. Libris*? Describe the character in detail, and explain what you like about him or her.
- 9. On page 139, Maid Marian says, "Each of us can choose who or what we shall be. We write out own stories, Sir William. We write them each and every day." In an essay, explain how this is the theme of the book. Use specific details from the text to support your answer.
- 10. Many parents and teachers are concerned that children today do not spend enough time reading. As a result, schools across the country require students to read over the summer. Do you think children should have to read over the summer? Write a letter to your principal explain your opinion. Your letter should be five paragraphs. Include an opening, three body paragraphs, and a conclusion. Use examples from your own life and detailed explanations to make your point. Consider the other side's point of view as you
